MINUTES

Meeting Date: April 10, 2006

After recitation of Pledge of Allegiance plus reading of minutes of previous meeting, Mr. Nunez talked about meeting at town hall and the Civic Association winning. One of the speakers, Norma Gonzalez, was at our Civic Meeting. Mr. Nunez thanked her for speaking so well for the community and asked her if she cared to address the meeting.

Ms. Gonzalez congratulated the North Bellmore Civic Association. She also talked about how well prepared everyone was who spoke at the meeting and said that it will be interesting to see what happens now.

Mr. Nunez then introduced Bill Carmen who will represent Tom McKeivitt, assemblyman, at our meetings when Mr. McKeivitt is in Albany.

Mr. Reinhart then spoke. He said the builder has the option to do one of the following: he has right to appeal the decision, or he can build as it has been decided, or he can sell the property. Regarding taxes – he did not know how much.

Mr. Reinhart then talked about walk-in church located on west side of Newbridge Road. He said there would be a public hearing June 14 regarding building conversion to religious use. They must have enough parking spaces on the property. People in area will be notified of meeting.

Police Officers Bilello and Heffernan were at meeting. Police Officer Bilello spoke. He said he cannot give out crime statistics at this time. You can look on Channel 12 to get information. He mentioned one person who has been hitting several banks in neighboring area. Officer Bilello also talked about identity theft. Another person will come to next meeting to talk about this topic. Relating to children - discussed kids with motor scooters and skateboards. He also mentioned also talking to 5th graders at Dinkelmeyer School. Talked about i-pods, porn videos, etc. Parents must watch what children see.

Town said Verizon and Cablevision can compete.

Steve Kozlowski discussed Jerusalem Avenue. We are negotiating with Town of Hempstead as to where lights will be, etc. Mr. Nunez said clock tower still in bidding phase. Said there will be no cost to taxpayers.

Cell tower is approved but negotiations still going on. Commissioner is willing to walk away if demands are not met by Verizon. People can call 409-4704 to get answers to questions.

Question asked about fire commissioner coming to meeting.

Mr. Denenberg also spoke and congratulated North Bellmore Civic Association.

Mr. Steve Kaufman, authority on medication plans, was introduced. He talked about Part D medical plan and number of plans people can choose from. He mentioned Epic as a good plan. He said Epic is free to all seniors. Drug price is the same no matter where you are. If you do not have plan you pay whatever the price is. There is also a patient assistance program.

Steve Kozlowski mentioned a meeting he attended about tax reform.
