MINUTES

Meeting Date: July 10, 2006

There was no police officer at the July meeting. Mr. Nunez said there were no specific topics and therefore people could talk about any subject. A few representatives from Town of Hempstead offices were at the meeting, Mr. Gary Sauer - Traffic Control, Mr. Tom Reed, Inspector, plus lady representing Angie Cullen.

Former Army Base - the builder will have to pay retroactive taxes as soon as the property is put on the tax roles. Mr. Reinhardt said taxes on former army base were delayed because property was not listed on tax roles. Taxes will start to be paid either by 10/2006 or 2007. Back taxes will also have to be paid.

Mr. Nunez then said in the process of approval of clock tower – it will take a few months.

Questions were raised on the following – potholes on Jerusalem Avenue and Albert Road parking at Jerusalem Avenue and bagel shop Rite Aide - also Lincoln Blvd. & Metropolitan area.

With regard to street lights, Mr. Gary Sauer from town spoke and said they are trying to get additional money. Mr. Reinhardt also talked about street lighting - said they are trying to get the state involved.

A man then spoke about enormous traffic problem at Waring Steet and Bellmore Avenue. He suggested more traffic signs were needed and complained of terrible parking conditions. There was a lengthy discussion about this matter. Said something has to be done immediately. Man also said big construction company is parking in no parking areas. Many other people joined in this discussion. Mr. Reed from the town said to call 911 - regarding parking, etc.

Someone also brought up was the matter of new gangs in town and mentioned too much graffiti. Man gave photos he took of various graffiti signs to Mr. Nunez. Mr. Nunez said he will try to have a meeting with police unit and suggested the community watch out for letters MS13.

Questions also rose about traffic light on Bellmore Avenue. Mr. Podolski believes there will be a study. Mr. Sauer said could have survey. Questions also rose regarding Broad Street being made one way. North Jerusalem Road and curb being replaced since it was smashed.

Discussion also raised on garbage being put out too early.

Church/House on Newbridge Road and large cross being put up. Mr. Reinhardt said it might be constitutional issue. Mr. Nunez said the area is not zoned for business.

Question rose regarding the electric signs on all firehouses and cost of same, volunteer ambulance project, Wantagh and Jerusalem beautification. Mr. Nunez said he no answer yet regarding the cell tower.

Mr. Podolski again mentioned kids hanging out near school and mentioned speeding on Waring Street - Camp Ave and Newbridge Road.

Mr. Denenberg said if you suspect a crime, or drug dealing call 911 - same with double parking. Mentioned drug scene in what is called Bellmore Plaza.

Mrs. Szatmary read the names of students who received awards from North Bellmore Civic Association.

Mr. Checkla mentioned checking expiration date of membership for people in North Bellmore Civic Association.

Mr. Nunez thanked the representative for Angie Cullen plus other town people who came to Civic meeting.
