Meeting Date: July 14, 2008

Mr. Nunez introduced Mr. David Denenberg, legislator who introduced Christopher Baron from his office. He also talked about insurance re hurricanes. Said he was having meeting July 23 at 7:30 at Wantagh High School.

Thereafter police officers Ed Knox and Mike Hefferman of POP (Problem Oriented Police) gave their report.

Officer Knox talked about re criminal mischief. Stressed making sure to lock car doors. There was graffiti at Bellmore railroad. A person was arrested. There were 4 to 6 cases of identify theft. Also said a lot of kids getting heroin. It is very cheap and a lot of kids are getting it. People have to be aware of this. Mr. Renaldo said the younger they start the harder it is to get rid of it. Must nip this now. Said some kids get addicted to pain killers. If Dr. does not give any more pain killers some kids go on heroin.

Mr. Renaldo mentioned kids hanging out by library .Mr. Podolski mentioned 4th of July, girls smoking at young age and hanging out. Police stressed calling 911

Dan Checkla introduced Assemblyman T. McDevitt who spoke of blood drive. Thereafter a gentleman from Tracor Oil was introduced. Talked about fuel oil and discount from his company.

Dolores Sedecca of Nassau County of Assessment was introduced—and spoke about former army base. Said if you have any specific questions call 571-0574.

She mentioned the taxes owner of property pays. She also said assessed value of former army base property is 14,172,380 for 08-09. It has a class 4 tax property value.

Questions were raised re church. Said tax based on ownership, exemption depends on what type of institution it is. Church has full exemption. Ms. Sedecca did not have document re church. Since then, according to article in Newsday and Bellmore Life town rejected tax exemption for church. .

Tom McDevitt also spoke about army base and said case going before court August 12 2-4.

Bob Podolski then introduced 2 people from Bellmore-Merrick Emergency.

Gentleman came up and said what to do in case of emergency. Number to call is 742-3300. He also talked about how to join organization which is located at Grand Avenue and Newbridge Road. Bob Podolski asked what training people receive.

Bill Reilly of fire department also spoke and said if there is a delay call – 911. Said his number is the fastest. There is charge for Bellmore-Merrick Emergency Service

Thereafter Mr. Renaldo spoke. He said \$2296.46 in Civic Association treasury. He read the new by-laws Said association wishes to raise dues to\$15.00. A vote was taken and there was unanimous agreement with new dues.

Mr. Renaldo also said cell tower should be completed in 30 days.

Steve Kozlowski said wants to get an annual date for dues.
