



North Bellmore Civic Association MINUTES Meeting Date: November 13, 2006

After recitation of Pledge of Allegiance and the reading of minutes of previous meeting, Ms. Cook mentioned the amount of money in the Civic Association fund.

Mr. Podolski thanked all those who attended the Joey Kola fundraising show.

Mr. Nunez mentioned that the Army Base project was still at a standstill. The owner is going to court.

In regards to the Jerusalem Avenue Project, most of the permits were granted – work will probably start after the snow storm season.

Ms. Rosanne Polansky, a North Bellmore resident, read a correspondence she had with the government concerning traffic conditions on Saw Mill, Bellmore and Newbridge Roads plus post office area. Mr. Nunez said he would have appreciated it if Ms. Polansky had notified the Civic Association about the correspondence.

Verizon has documents to be filed for the antennas on the poles for cell phones.

Police officers Heffernan and Billello discussed speaking to principal of school about graffiti and also gangs. They said 6 kids were arrested. Those doing graffiti in playground will be arrested. They also said signs saying no trespassing will be put up. Mr. Podolski also entered discussion. He said if you see people hanging out near library, call 911 and when you call describe exactly what you see.

Mr. Nunez asked about gang activity and if anything is being done to prevent increase of gang activity in the future. Police mentioned having discussions with 5th grade students. Gangs were mentioned in the student discussion although other matters were discussed.

Mr. Denenberg mentioned a gang prevention program run by the Long Island Crisis Center.

Officers Heffernan and Billello said there is a program starting this year in some schools on how to avoid certain lifestyles. It is still in the process of being set up. There was also a discussion about incident re Kennedy High School.

There was a further discussion about unmarked cars, parking and speeding problems.

After this discussion was completed M. Nunez introduced Maureen O'Connell, County Clerk, who talked about her various duties.

She discussed the history of the position and what is involved to see that records are accurate, plus processing of mortgages, deeds, etc. Records are kept of land ownership, mortgages, judgments, and seeing that records are accurate. Her address is 240 Old Country Road. She is also involved in judgments and law suits for land. Ms. O'Connell also mentioned identity theft.



Mr. Nunez asked how she is learning the job about historical society, deeds, mortgages, etc. Ms. O'Connell said she is learning every day and has a very good staff. Does not take any calls on the telephone, however. Now they have e-mail, internet filing and processing over the internet.
