Meeting Date: September 10, 2007

Mr. Nunez then introduced various town officials at meeting, D. McDonough, G. Hughes, J. Reinhart, Charles Fuschillo He then mentioned students who received bonds from the civic association. The students came up to the front of the room and displayed their plaques.

Mr Nunez then mentioned meeting taking place Sept. 19 at Vamps regarding church plus meeting with attorney of opposition at 7:00 on Sept. 26.

Thereafter Mr. Nunez introduced Senator Fuschillo. Topics discussed by Senator Fuschillo were the star program, rebate checks for enhanced star plus applying for star rebates. He then spoke about DWI and getting stronger laws passed re driving drunk.

Senator Fuschillo then began a discussion about identity theft of which he was a victim and how cautious people should be especially with social security numbers and also computers.

Other areas he brought up were sexual offenders and an airline passenger Bill of Rights. He discussed what rights they are.

Legislator David G McDonough of the 19th assembly district also spoke.

After the legislators completed speaking a gentleman in the audience spoke about the difference in gas prices in various states. A lady asked if rebates are considered taxable income which is the case.

Further issues were the lighting situation, street lights and crossing on Newbridge and Jerusalem. Mr. Nunez read letter re lighting.

A Ms. Polanski read letters she had received in answer to her letters re traffic on Jerusalem and Newbridge.

Ms. Norma Gonzalez mentioned meeting on public safety on Sept. 27 at 7:00 PM at firehouse. David Denenberg discussed meeting he would have 9/25 at library. Another person asked about political posters going up on Sunrise Highway and Bellmore Ave. Mr. Denenberg said that not allowed on public property but can be posted on private property.
